The Poughkeepsie Children's Cabinet Fiscal Map is a comprehensive analysis of public and philanthropic investments in youth and children in Poughkeepsie. It is designed to be a resource for city leaders and youth services stakeholders seeking to visualize funding streams and align spending with priorities. In addition, nonprofits, residents, and community groups are encouraged to use the resource to better understand investments in youth and children. Through a data-driven process, the Poughkeepsie Children's Cabinet, in partnership with the national nonprofit Children's Funding Project, worked with public agencies, philanthropic donors, and nonprofits to obtain fiscal data related to youth, children and relevant family services. Fiscal data was organized into different categories to provide a more detailed analysis. How to Use: To take full advantage of the fiscal map's data visualization software, move your cursor and click on the segments of the data visualization elements (i.e. chart, pie, table) to view the specific information for that segment. Fault Code Insights

Code P0457 - EVAP System Leak Detected (fuel cap loose/off)

Description The fault code P0457 indicates that the vehicle's On-Board Diagnostics (OBD) system has detected a leak in the Evaporative Emission Control (EVAP) system, often triggered by a loose or missing fuel cap. This system is designed to prevent fuel vapors from escaping into the atmosphere, and a leak can lead to increased emissions and potential fuel odor.

Risks

1. Increased emissions may lead to failing emissions tests, impacting vehicle compliance.
2. Fuel vapors escaping can create a potential fire hazard if not addressed.
3. A loose fuel cap can lead to fuel evaporation, resulting in decreased fuel efficiency.

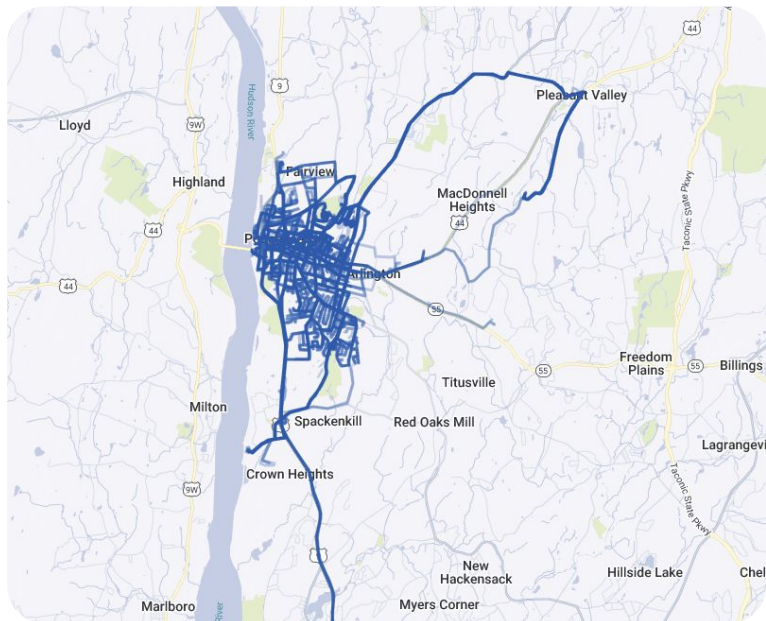

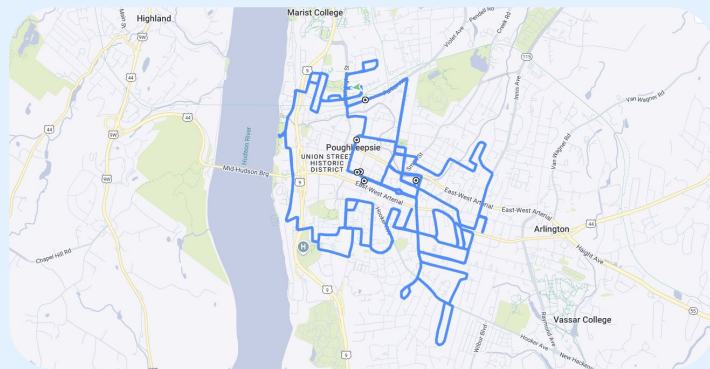
Coverage Map

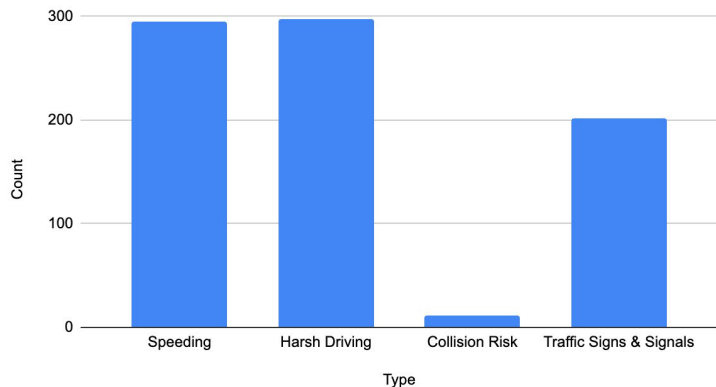

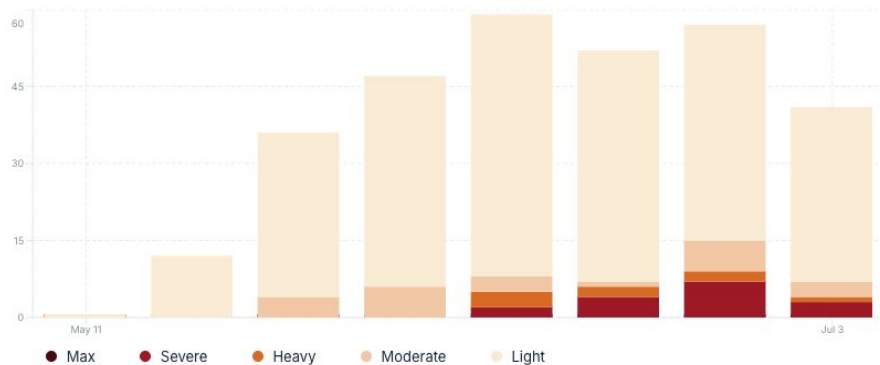

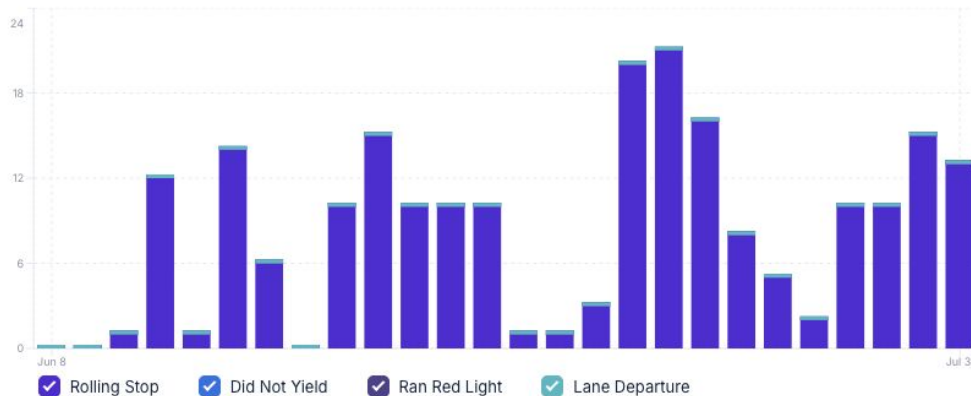

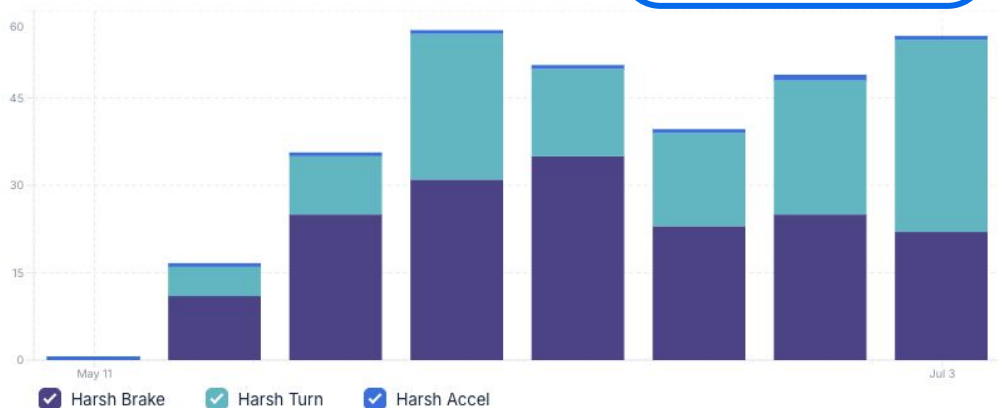

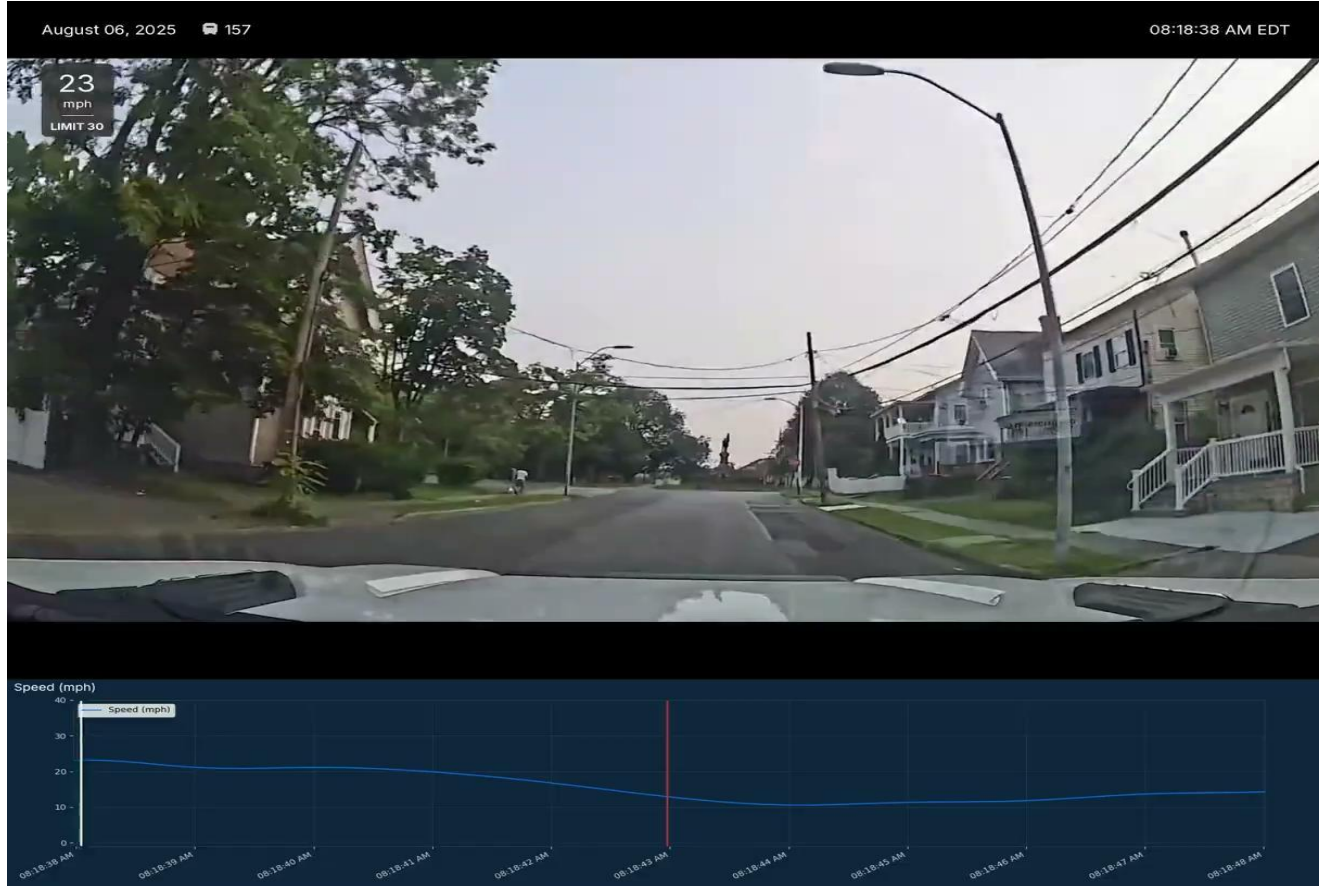

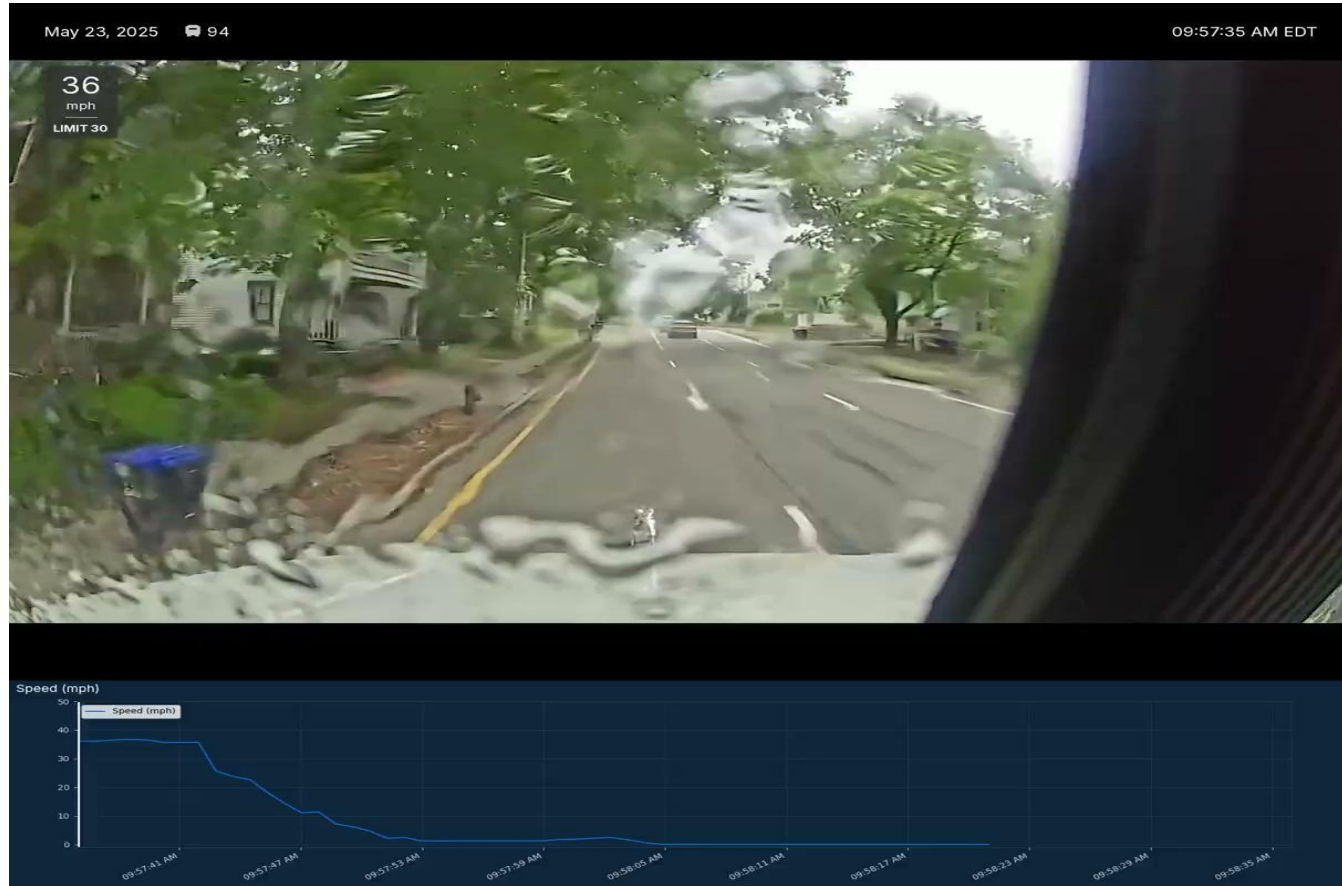
